STUDENT SPOTLIGHT

Coral Dean, junior pictured right, completed an internship last summer that was an impactful experience. Through thorough research, a well-done application and interview, and genuine passion for the work, Coral was accepted as a counselor for Camp Easter Seals. Please read more about her story and the internship process below.



"Dear Fellow Students,

My name is Coral and I am a Psychology major with minors in Human Biology and Spanish. My career goal is to earn my doctorate in Occupational Therapy. Many OT schools will not accept your application if you do not have field experience in volunteering and internships. This experience is important as you have the opportunity to gain valuable knowledge which may help you determine for sure whether or not you have chosen the right career.

During the summer of 2015 I had the opportunity to work as a Counselor at Camp Easter Seals UCP. It was both the most rewarding and most difficult experience in my life. I was responsible for the total care of campers assigned to me. We had both youth and adult sessions, and campers with disabilities ranging from autism to cerebral palsy. My official responsibilities included: understanding the physical, medical, and mental needs of each camper; supervising and assisting campers in daily activities such as transferring, bathing, feeding, and dressing; assisting campers in daily activities such as swimming, rock wall climbing, and horseback riding; setting an example for campers through cleanliness, sharing, and punctuality; and maintaining all paperwork, and enforcing safety regulations.



Building friendships, earning trust, and assisting the campers in setting goals and reaching their full potential was what made each day worthwhile. It was hard work both physically and mentally. I worked 12 days on, 2 days off, 24 hours a day for 10 weeks. I have never been so exhausted. But then you would hear a camper call your name asking for a hug, watch them reaching the top of the rock wall, or simply show you a big smile and all of the exhaustion melted away. For many of the campers this is the only opportunity they have to be away from home, and to gain valuable experiences like fishing, canoeing, etc. It was truly an experience like no other for both them and me. I still keep in touch with many of the campers today.

In the fall of 2014 I started researching various job opportunities, and found very few hands on experiences until I ran across Camp Easter Seals. I applied for the job and interviewed via Skype during the Spring of 2015. A background and reference check was completed and I accepted the position within the month. I made a request to the school to accept this as an internship and once the request was accepted, I was responsible for meeting my advisor, who assisted me with paperwork and gave me a list of responsibilities that I would need to complete the course. Camp Easter Seals provided my food and shelter for the summer, and I also received a small check.

This opportunity would be excellent for anyone considering going into Occupational Therapy, Physical Therapy, Rehabilitation Counseling, Speech and Language Specialist, anything in the medical field or Psychology.

I am so happy that I accepted this position, and gained the valuable experience that it gave to me. Please do not expect easy; it was very hard work but so very worth it. The rewards cannot be put into words.

Coral has recently been accepted into another summer internship program. She will be spending 4 weeks at the NYU Medical school, at the Langone Medical Center. Their rehabilitation centers are among the top 10 in the country. Student interns observe health care professionals in their assigned field, meet together to attend lectures related to rehabilitation and hospital care, and also meet for weekly small group conferences to have discussions about medical ethics and problems faced by individuals with various types of handicaps and disabilities.
